White Flower Appeal please look out on 18th January 2026 on behalf of SPUC for this significant fundraiser. This funds their efforts to keep petitioning against the law coming in on decriminalization of abortion up to birth. **SPUC** - Abortion up to Birth Bill and Assisted Suicide Bill. Both of these Bills are currently being scrutinised and debated in the House of Lords. Thank you if you have already written to some Peers but, we need you to keep up the pressure and continue writing. This is because the Government has now allocated another 10 days for debate, ending on the 24 April, to deal with the 1071 Amendments tabled for the Leadbeater Assisted Suicide Bill. The Abortion up to Birth Bill will be debated on 27th January. Amendments have been tabled to remove the Bill and end the pills by post policy. We now have more time to lobby by members of the House of Lords. Towards a synodal church – Conversations in the Spirit How do we listen to each other well? How do we step back from our own agendas to be attentive to where the Spirit is moving? How can we make better decisions about organising ourselves as Christian communities? How do we enrich our parish communal life with enriching conversations? The Synod process has emphasised the importance of listening and good conversations in our community life. However, these are not always so easy in practice!

Blessed Sacrament Exeter are hosting a one day face-to-face facilitator training workshop with Fr Matthew Nunes, Director of the School for Synodality. This Conversations in the Spirit workshop will run on Saturday 21st February and will introduce the principles of holding prayerful, truthful and safe conversations which value gracious listening and courageous speaking.
